Psychoanalysis in Other Places An Epistemological Perspective

Why is psychoanalysis relevant in profoundly different contexts - cultural, social, historical, and clinical? This lecture addresses this question by discussing the fundamental role that translation plays in the epistemology of psychoanalysis. The work of Girindrasekhar Bose is taken as a case study to reflect on what it means to talk about psychoanalysis in "other places" and how we might understand its relevance in them.
